Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education ("CMS Board") hereby responds to the State of North Carolina's accounting dated December 19, 2022.

Pursuant to the court's March 13, 2023, Scheduling Order and Notice of Hearing, the

1. The North Carolina Supreme Court's November 4, 2022 decision in this case, *Hoke County Bd. of Educ. v. State*, 382 N.C. 386, 879 S.E.2d 193 (2022) ("*Leandro IV*"), *inter alia*, remanded the case "to the trial court for the narrow purpose of recalculating the amount of funds to be transferred in light of the State's 2022 Budget." *Id.* at 391, 879 S.E.2d at 198-99.

2. With respect to that recalculation, the parties previously agreed and submitted to the court a proposed schedule of submissions on that issue, whereby the State would submit by December 19, 2022, its accounting showing any recalculations in light of the State's 2022 Budget, and whereby the other parties would respond by January 20, 2023.

3. Consistent with that schedule, the State of North Carolina submitted its accounting on December 19, 2022, which was accompanied by an affidavit from the Chief Deputy Director of State Budget for the North Carolina Office of State Budget and Management and accompanying exhibits setting forth, *inter alia*, the remaining amounts of funding required to implement the action items in the Comprehensive Remedial Plan years 2 and 3 (the "State's submission").

4. Based on that accounting, the State calculated the following amounts owed to the following State agencies in order to fund implementation of the Comprehensive Remedial Plan years 2 and 3:

• Department of Health and Human Services ("DHHS"): \$133,900,00;

• Department of Public Instruction ("DPI"): \$509,701,707; and

• University of North Carolina System: \$34,200,000.

5. On January 20, 2023, the Plaintiffs and the Plaintiff-Intervenors jointly submitted a response to the accounting, indicating that they had reviewed the State's submission and

related materials and did not dispute the accuracy of the State's accounting. No other parties submitted responses at that time.

6. At the status conference held on March 10, 2023, the Legislative Intervenors requested additional time to respond to the State's accounting. In its March 13, 2023, Scheduling Order and Notice of Hearing, the court permitted any parties to submit additional "briefing and/or affidavit evidence" addressing the Supreme Court's instruction for the "trial court to recalculate the appropriate distributions in light of the State's 2022 Budget." *Leandro IV*, 382 N.C. at 476, 879 S.E.2d at 249.

7. The CMS Board, having reviewed the State's submission, hereby joins the other Plaintiff Parties in informing the Court that it does not dispute the facts as set out in the affidavit or the accuracy of the State's recalculation of the remaining amount of funds needed to fully fund years 2 and 3 of the Comprehensive Remedial Plan.

8. Therefore, the CMS Board respectfully requests the Court enter an order that the following recalculated amounts are owed to the following State agencies:

- Department of Health and Human Services ("DHHS"): \$133,900,00;
- Department of Public Instruction ("DPI"): \$509,701,707; and
- University of North Carolina System: \$34,200,000.
