#### **Legislative Update**

#### Recent Bill Action

- NCGA was in session on October 20-23.
- Lawmakers passed three new bills, all of which have become law; S449, the latest "mini budget," directly impacts K-12 education:
  - Senate Bill 249 (SL 2025-95): Realign Congressional Districts 2025
  - Senate Bill 777 (SL 2025-96): General Assembly Appointments
  - Senate Bill 449 (SL 2025-97): Continuing Budget Operations Part IV
- House announced it is not expecting to hold any votes <u>for the</u> <u>remainder of 2025</u>; Senate later confirmed no votes expected in 2025

#### **Newly Enacted Bill Impacting K-12 Education**

#### SB 449 (SL 2025-97): Continuing Budget Operations Part IV

- Includes technical change to codify that virtual cooperative innovative high schools receive \$200,000 in supplemental funding each fiscal year
- Includes technical correction to remove contingent school technology "break/fix rate" in SL 2025-46
- Appropriates \$25 million in recurring funding to the Pay Plan Reserve for the 2025-26 fiscal year; funding can be used to cover additional salary needs from teacher step increases

#### **Education-Related Bills To Watch**

- HB 87: Educational Choice for Children Act (ECCA)\*
  - Placed on 11/17 House Calendar for potential veto override vote, but action TBD
- SB 227: Eliminating "DEI" in Public Education\*
  - Placed on 11/17 House Calendar for potential veto override vote, but action TBD
- SB 558: Eliminating "DEI" in Public Higher Ed\*
  - Placed on 11/17 House Calendar for potential veto override vote, but action TBD
- SB 257: 2025 Appropriations Act
  - In conference committee since 6/5
- HB 389: Continuing Budget Operations Part III
  - Latest version passed in Senate 9/22 and sent to House for further consideration

- Anticipate limited revenue for the 2026-27 fiscal year
- When possible, want to prioritize budget and legislative requests based on the Strategic Plan
