What audiences see and hear from EdNC is the product of human beings. Our humans are what make EdNC special, and they will continue to lead the work we do no matter what technology we adopt.

EdNC staff remain responsible for everything we produce and publish. Everything you see, hear, and interact with on our website, social media, or newsletters was created and/or reviewed by a human for accuracy. If you ever see anything that is inaccurate, [let us know](#).

We consistently review our uses of AI. As of May 2026, we primarily use AI to assist with tasks such as transcribing interviews, analyzing data, editing photos or audio, and writing search engine optimization descriptions, which are based entirely on human-authored content. We also use AI to power a [chatbot](#) that helps users search the N.C. Center for Public Policy Research (NCCPPR) archive.

EdNC staff are not using generative AI to edit copy nor to create original content published by EdNC, including text, images, video, or audio. If AI plays a role in producing a [perspective](#), we will let you know: the appropriate AI will be labeled as an author, and we'll explain how we used it in an editor's note.

Your [privacy](#) is important to us. We do not input private or sensitive information into AI tools. If we decide to use AI tools that can personalize your website experience, we will be explicit about how your data is collected and how it was used.

The world of AI and journalism is rapidly changing. We will continue to evaluate this policy and our uses of AI as technologies evolve.
